


# Schriebers Meadow Trailhead Parking

## Directions:

From I-5 take Hwy 20 east or the Cook Road east to Hwy 20. Drive past the [Mt. Baker Ranger District](#) office located (north side) at the intersection of Hwy 9 & Hwy 20. Continue on Hwy 20 east for 16 miles to milepost 82. Turn left (north) on the Baker Lake Highway (Forest Service Road 11). Continue for 12 miles, turn left on FS road 12 (just as you cross over Rocky Creek). Travel 3.6 miles to the junction of FS road 13. Stay right and follow FS road 13 for 5.3 miles. The trailhead is at the end of FS road 13.

To Baker Lake Trailhead from Schriebers Meadow Trailhead: Go out to FS road 11. Turn left and continue driving to the end of the road (approx. 14 miles) to the trailhead for Baker Lake. Discover Pass Required.

**Friday Ride from Schriebers Meadows:** Ride out time is 11 am. You must RSVP to Beth at 425-327-4881. If the weather is ugly, I'll probably cancel.

There is one challenging location we will deal with. On the far side of the river crossing there is a snow & debris field that is still melting. I walked it two weeks ago and it was passable. This is not a good time to ride your green horse.

I encourage those who are riding Baker Lake on Saturday to drive & camp there on Friday night. There is more room to park & camp.

**Saturday Ride from the north end of Baker Lake:** Discover Pass required. Ride out time is 11 am.

From I-5 take Hwy 20 east or the Cook Road east to Hwy 20. Drive past the [Mt. Baker Ranger District](#) office located (north side) at the intersection of Hwy 9 & Hwy 20. Continue on Hwy 20 east for 16 miles to milepost 82. Turn left (north) on the Baker Lake Highway (Forest Service Road 11). Continue for 26 miles to the end of the road at the trail head.

I encourage people to camp here Friday night. Pit toilet, no people water, water for horses at the river.

If you want to **ride Sunday** you have a couple of choices. **Les Hilde** (off Hwy 20) or **Blanchard Mtn.** Both of these locations require a Discover Pass.

From the Baker Lake road, go out to Hwy 20, turn right or west.

To **Les Hilde**, look for Hamilton Cemetary road, take the next right on to Cabin Creek Road by the fire station. At the next stop sign turn right onto Hamilton Cemetary road. Turn north (left) on Medford road. Drive until you reach the Les Hilde Trailhead.

**Blanchard Mtn:** follow Hwy 20 out to I-5. Get on I-5 northbound, exit # 240 to Alger. Turn left at end of off ramp onto Lake Samish Road, cross over freeway. Turn left on the first paved road, Barrel Springs road. This is a sharp, tight left turn, give yourself some room if there is a car waiting to pull out onto the main road.

Continue on Barrel Springs road maybe a mile. Look for gravel road on your right. There may or may not be a sign about Trailhead parking. Follow the gravel road less than a mile to the parking area on your right.

Please back into the parking space. Do not park parallel to the hillside. Leave room for others. There is a concrete outhouse at this location.

The trail starts about a quarter of a mile down the road from the parking area. There is a sign and the trail entrance is on your right.
